2. PSLE 2025 Results

The school would like to congratulate the 2025 cohort for their PSLE results. I would like to wish the graduating class of 2025 all the best in their future endeavours and encourage them to continue to stretch themselves in their potential and always challenge their personal best.

3. Safety and Security Matters

a. Requirement for Visitor's Registration

The safety of your children is of paramount importance to us. All visitors to the school are required to report to the Security Guard Post for registration before proceeding to the General Office. Please display the issued "Visitor Pass" visibly at all times as unauthorized personnel will be asked to leave the school immediately. Parents/guardians are not permitted to go near the classrooms. If you are waiting for your child/ward, please wait at the General Office.

b. Drop-off / Pick-up Points

For safety reasons, parents who drive your children to school are not allowed to drive into school compound. You may drop-off / pick-up your child/ward at the nearby HDB car parks at Blocks 161 or 162. You are strongly advised not to drop-off / pick-up your children along Yishun Street 11 as it is against traffic rules and to reduce traffic congestion. However, on rainy days, you will be allowed to drive into the school compound.

c. Road Safety Measures

All students have been taught to practise kerb drill when crossing the road. We seek your support to reinforce road safety messages and set an example for them by using pedestrian crossings when crossing roads at all times, especially for students who use the main gate (Gate A) and the gate at the school canteen (Gate B).

- For students entering the school via the main school gate (Gate A)
Students are to cross the street (Yishun Street 11) by using the pedestrian traffic light located just outside the main gate.
- For students entering the school via Gate B at the school canteen which is near the bus stop
Students are to use the zebra crossing located near Block 123 along Yishun Street 11 or the pedestrian traffic light just outside Yishun Primary School.
- Jaywalking
Jaywalking is an offence in Singapore. It is a dangerous act and a fine of \$50 is payable for the first offence. Parents and students should not jaywalk when crossing the roads to school.

d. Cycling to School

For their own safety, students are strongly discouraged from cycling to school. All cyclists are required to complete a permission form which is available from the General Office. If your child / ward must cycle to school, please ensure that he / she knows safe cycling rules and is a competent cyclist. Protective gear such as a properly secured helmet, shoes (with laces properly tied), elbow and knee pads are to be worn to protect against serious injuries.

Please refer to the safety advisory (attached) from Singapore Police Force, Land Transport Authority and Singapore Road Safety Council.

4. Health Related Matters Personal and Social Responsibility

Students are to maintain a high standard of personal hygiene and observe school routines such as washing of hands and wipe down. Please pack a spare mask in the school bag for use should he/she start to experience flu symptoms while in school.

We seek parents' support to keep schools a safe environment for students. If your child/ward is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child/ward is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g. by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups).

Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility and stay safe.

5. School Bags

We encourage our students to carry bags made of lightweight material and to avoid carrying heavy and fanciful water bottles, big boxes of colour pencils or books not required for the day. All students are advised to pack their bags according to the class timetable.

6. Communication

Class Mentors will be sending out an introductory letter to connect with you. All parents / guardians are encouraged to use the AIPS Students' Handbook as a means to communicate with the teacher. You are also welcome to contact us via the school email (aips@moe.edu.sg) or at 67592906. Teachers' emails are provided on the school website.

a. Availability of internet access and digital devices

Your reply is appreciated as this information is important to the school in planning and providing support to your child / ward.

b. Personal Data Protection Act (New students who are joining us at AIPS)

The school will be writing to you for your consent of the use of your child's / ward's photographs and/or video recordings for our school publications, website, social media channels and/or other official school communication channels. The school will ensure that your child/ward is portrayed with respect and dignity. We thank you for your reply. Your consent for the use of such photographs and/or videos of your child/ward will be in effect for all their years of education in our school.
