### 2. Positive Behaviours - Zero Tolerance to Bullying

At Ahmad Ibrahim Primary School, we believe every child deserves a safe, respectful, and caring environment. All forms of hurtful behaviour (including bullying) —whether physical, verbal, social, or online — are not tolerated. As a school, we expect our students to treat one another with kindness and respect, and we are committed to working closely with parents to nurture these values in our children.

As part of the school's student management approach,

- a. School rules and values are communicated to students regularly.
- b. We actively encourage students to look out for one another, speak up against inappropriate behaviours, and seek help from trusted adults when incidents and offences occur.
- c. When hurtful behaviours occur, we take timely action. Our approach pairs appropriate disciplinary measures with education and support to help students learn from mistakes, make amends, and grow in character. We will engage you and enlist your help to monitor your child's wellbeing. Parents, you are our valued partners in this journey of your child's education. We thank you for always role-modelling positive behaviours and language as your child looks to you as their first and most important teachers. We seek your strong support in these:

- a. Please monitor your child's online interactions and be beside them when they access the internet. Many of the learnt behaviours, both good and inappropriate are from exposure to online sources.
- b. Explain why certain behaviours are inappropriate to your child using 'teachable moments'.
- c. Reinforce values of respect and empathy at home, guide your child towards responsible and compassionate behaviours, and encourage your child to report concerns/incidents to their Class Mentors, Subject Teachers, Year Heads or School Leaders.

Together, we can create a safe, caring and enabling school environment where every child feels they belong and can thrive.

Here are some updates for the month of July 2026.

### 3. Youth Day (Monday, 6 July)

Youth Day falls on Monday, 6 July 2026 and students need not report to school on that day. All students will report back to school on Tuesday, 7 July 2026.

### 4. P5 National Education (NE) Show (Saturday, 11 July)

Since 1997, the National Day Parade (NDP) full dress rehearsal provides an opportunity to grow a sense of belonging and national pride in Primary 5 students, and to give them a preview of the NDP. This year, our Primary 5 students will be participating in the NE Show at the National Stadium on Saturday, 11 July. More details on reporting and dismissal information will be shared with P5 parents via Parents Gateway.

### 5. Racial Harmony Day (Tuesday, 21 July)

Schools commemorate Racial Harmony Day (RHD) on 21 July each year to mark the anniversary of the 1964 race riots. It is a day for students to reflect on and celebrate the nation's success as a harmonious society, built on cultural diversity. The 2026 RHD Theme is 'Our People, Our Tapestry'. During the celebrations, our students will be engaged in recess fringe activities to let them appreciate the cultural background and identity of self and others. At the same time, students will learn to show sensitivity and openness in interactions with people from diverse social, cultural and religious communities to promote social cohesion.

### 6. P6 Prelim English and Mother Tongue Languages Oral Exams (Wednesday and Thursday, 22-23 July)

The P6 Prelim English and Mother Tongue Languages Oral Examinations will be conducted on Wednesday, 22 July, and Thursday, 23 July, from 2pm to 5pm. Students will be dismissed from school once they have completed their oral examination for the day. For P6 students taking NTIL, foreign language in-lieu of Mother Tongue Language (MTL) or are exempted from MTL, they will only need to stay back in school on the day of their English or Foundation English Language oral examination.

### 7. Primary 5 Cohort Camp 2026 (Monday, 27 July to Wednesday, 29 July)

Our Primary 5 students will be attending their cohort camp on Monday, 27 July to Wednesday, 29 July. This year's camp will be held in MOE Labrador Outdoor Adventure Learning Centre and will be residential, with our students staying in for 3 days and 2 nights. More details on the camp will be shared to parents and students closer to the date.

### 8. AIPS Week of Wonder (Monday, 27 July to Wednesday, 29 July)

From **Monday, 27 July to Wednesday, 29 July**, our school will be holding our inaugural **Week of Wonder** – a purposeful initiative designed to bring learning to life for every child. During curriculum time on these three days, students across all levels will participate in engaging, hands-on experiences beyond the classroom and learning journeys that spark curiosity, deepen their understanding of the world around them, and develop important 21st Century Competencies. Students will also strengthen our school's **CaR<sup>3</sup>inG** values, build character and leadership, and discover the joy of learning in new and exciting ways. Programme details for each level will be shared closer to the date.

### 9. School Emergency Preparedness Exercise

Our school will be conducting the second emergency preparedness exercise in July, during school hours. As part of the SGSecure framework to safeguard Singapore and our way of life, this exercise aims to ensure the safety and well-being of all students and staff by preparing them to respond to emergencies in the school premises and be familiar with the safety and evacuation procedures. The well-being of all students and staff is important to us. We seek your understanding and support for the upcoming emergency preparedness exercise.

### 10. Termination of School Payphone Service
